of liverpool in their work in filming recording and analyzing shared reading groups led by the reader organization it refers both to the
work of psychology within literary texts and to the responses of multifarious reader participants to literature read live and aloud in small
community groups within a variety of settings in particular psychology in action has meant seeing readers suddenly activated into deep
personal thinking responding to situations imaginatively simulated by reading literature in ways that trigger surprised and involuntary
emotion autobiographical memory and spontaneous empathy*

the primary purpose of this book is twofold first to demonstrate empirically against a conceptual background drawn from multiple

such as literary reading can effectively combat symptoms of a condition as intractable as chronic pain second to explore what this
evidence tells us about pain as a lived experience as well as a condition in urgent need of new treatment options and about literature
and the reading of fiction and poetry as therapeutic influences in contemporary health and healthcare most particularly in alleviating the
often severe mental health difficulties with which chronic pain is almost universally associated based on unique empirical research with
people who are living with chronic pain this book is the first of its kind to demonstrate the value of literature and literary reading both
as a discourse for understanding and finding pain and as an intervention in its treatment*

existential challenges a psychoanalytic perspective on reading literature offers a unique glimpse into the unconscious psychic processes and development involved in reading the author listens to the free associations of various literary characters in numerous scenarios where the characters are themselves reading literature thus revealing the mysterious ways in which reading literature helps us and contributes to our development the book offers an introduction both to classic literature poe proust sartr e semp r [?] n pessoa agnon and more and to the major psychoanalytic concepts that can be used in reading it all described and widely explained before being used as tools for interpreting the literary illustrations the book thus offers a rich lexical psychoanalytic source alongside its main aim in analysing the reader s psychological mechanisms and development psychoanalytic interpretation of those literary readers opens three main avenues to the reader s experience the transference relations toward the literary characters the literary work as means to transcend beyond the reader s self identity and existential boundaries and mobilization of internal dialectic tensions towards new integration and psychic equilibrium an epilogue concludes by emphasising the transformational power embedded in reading literature the fascinating dialogue between literature and psychoanalysis illuminates hitherto concealed aspects of each discipline and contributes to new insights in both fields a psychoanalytic perspective on reading literature will be of great interest not only to psychoanalytic psychotherapists and literature scholars but also to a wider readership beyond these areas of study
