from his injuries hemingway fell in love with a nurse named agnes von kurowsky ernest had to return to america but he vowed that one day he would marry von kurowsky it was not to be however as hemingway received a letter only months after returning home saying that his love had fallen for an italian officer he was devastated and his initial broken heart may explain why he made a habit out of leaving women before they could leave him hemingway was married four times and had affairs in each of his marriages
